Some facts about the programs:

Safe Drinking Water Fund

Clean water, basic toilets and good hygiene practices are essential for the survival and development of children. Today, there are around 2.4 billion people who do not use improved sanitation, and 663 million who do not have access to improved water sources. For children under five, water- and sanitation-related diseases are one of the leading causes of death. Every day, over 800 children die from preventable diseases caused by poor water, and a lack of sanitation and hygiene. BAB's contribution will provide over 25 million litres of clean water for children and communities without access to clean water.

Immunization

Vaccines keep children alive and healthy by protecting them against disease. Around the world, 18.7 million babies - nearly 20 per cent - do not receive a complete set of commonly available vaccines and are vulnerable to life-threatening diseases. As long as they aren't reached with immunization, an estimated 1.5 million children will die needlessly of preventable illnesses.

BAB's contribution will be used to purchase vaccines to immunize children against polio & rubella.
